End-Term Outcome Measurement Report

31 December 2025



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Summary

At this stage, we are reaching the end of the PoD programme launched in 2021. The purpose of this report is to assess the impact of the activities carried out between 2021 and 2025. During this period, the programme and its targets were adjusted to adapt to changes in the national context.

This results measurement report covers the four areas of intervention, defined on the basis of the final and intermediate outcomes. Each (intermediate) outcome is linked to a set of indicators, which are presented in detail below. The report provides both a quantitative and qualitative analysis of the activities carried out, enabling an overview of the overall progress achieved by the CEMI following these five years of implementation.

Outcome measures are based on data collected through surveys, questionnaires, and formal and informal meetings conducted by the CEMI team, comprising the director, the scientific coordinator, the programme manager and the monitoring and evaluation officer.



1. Methodology

Data collection took place between January 2021 and October 2025.

The data were collected by the CEMI monitoring and evaluation team, in coordination with the programme officers.

We used structured questionnaires, evaluation forms for each session of the cycle, and internal databases to centralise and analyse the information collected. This approach was supplemented by regular follow-ups with participants to verify the consistency of the data, obtain further details where necessary, and ensure continuous monitoring of changes in the indicators.

No major constraints were encountered. The main challenge lay primarily in ensuring that data was regularly updated, given the adjustments and changes occurring throughout the programme. However, this did not significantly affect the data collection process.

These constraints had a limited impact. They mainly required more frequent updates to the information and ongoing verification to ensure that the data accurately reflected the changes that had taken place. However, they did not significantly affect the quality or reliability of the measured values.

The main challenge was to rapidly incorporate changes and updates throughout the cycle. This did not affect data quality, but required close coordination and regular verification of the information. These challenges were overcome through continuous updating of the databases, close follow-up with participants, and systematic triangulation of the information collected.

Compared with the baseline and mid-term measurements, we have made several improvements, including:

- A more precise structure for the questionnaires,
- Greater standardisation of the assessment forms,
- Better planning of follow-up with participants,
- More systematic updating of the databases.

These adjustments have helped to improve the consistency, quality and continuity of data collection.

2. Outcome measures

2.1 LTO1

2.1.1 Intermediate outcome indicator 1

With regard to this outcome, we have no planned or completed activities. However, CEMI's contribution to this LTO is outlined in the *Outcome Harvesting* report, where it supports its consortium partners in setting up democracy schools by providing assistance and expertise, and by strengthening the skills of the experts and staff involved in the programme.



2.2 LTO2: Young people and women aspiring to become political and civic leaders are influential agents of change (national level).

2.2.1 Impact indicator 1

This indicator is used to measure the number of participants – women and young people – affiliated with political parties or organisations who feel able to participate in the decision-making process within their respective organisations. It refers to their involvement and their sense of being stakeholders in the decision-making process.

To measure this indicator, we distribute questionnaires to participants at the start and end of each training cycle, including a question on their perception of their ability to participate in decision-making processes within their organisation. This applies to participants in the first mixed-level TSoP1 cohort, the second-level TSoP2 cohort (programme implemented in 2025), the ToT cohort up to 2023, the Women & Youth MPs Academy in 2025, the OOC between 2024 and 2025, and the ToT1 & ToT2 programmes (both implemented in 2025).

The baseline was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the mid-term figure represents the cumulative number of participants from 2021 to mid-2023 who feel capable of participating in decision-making processes within their organisations following the training cycles. The final value represents the cumulative number of participants from 2021 to 2025, taking into account the changes that have taken place.

The definition of the indicator and the data collection process remained the same between the baseline measurement and the final measurement, whilst the programmes taken into account for the calculation changed. During 2024 and 2025, new training programmes were added and implemented: the OOC programme, designed to replace the ToT implemented between 2021 and 2023; the Women and Youth Academy, designed and implemented in 2025; and the ToT1 and ToT2 programmes, implemented solely in 2025

2.2.2 Intermediate outcome indicator 2

This indicator is used to measure the number of organisations that have strengthened their organisational capacity, represented in the first mixed-class level TSoP1 – which combines civic and political actors – as well as in the ToT class, which has a clear organisational structure and was implemented up to 2023, the OOC cohort, a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025; the second level, TSoP2, implemented in 2025; the



Women & Youth MPs Academy, implemented in 2025; and the ToT1 & ToT2 (both programmes implemented in 2025).

This indicator is measured using the database updated on the basis of the application forms completed by participants in the first-level mixed-gender TSoP1 course, the ToT course (up to 2023), the OOC course (2024 and 2025), the second-level TSoP2 course (2025), the Women & Youth MPs Academy (2025), and ToT1 and ToT2 (both in 2025).

The definition of the indicator and the data collection process remained the same between the baseline and the final measurement, whilst the programmes included in the calculation changed.

The figure 37 represents the number of youth-led CSOs that are represented in the first mixed cohort (TSoP1) and the ToT cohort and that have strengthened their organisational capacities. The figure 99 represents the number of youth-led CSOs that have strengthened their organisational capacities and are represented in the first level – the mixed TSoP1 cohort, the second level TSoP2 in 2025, the ToT cohort up to 2023, the OOC cohort between 2024 and 2025, the Women & Youth MPs Academy in 2025, and the ToT1 & ToT2 (both programmes implemented in 2025).

The baseline was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the mid-term value represents the number of CSOs that have strengthened their organisational capacities and are represented in the first mixed TSoP1 cohort and the ToT cohort, accumulated between 2021 and mid-2023. The final value represents the number of CSOs that have strengthened their organisational capacities and are represented in the first level – the mixed TSoP1 cohort, the second level TSoP2 in 2025, the ToT cohort up to 2023, the OOC cohort between 2024 and 2025, the Women & Youth Academy and MPs Academy in 2025, and the ToT1 & ToT2 (both programmes implemented in 2025).

Given the national context, the CSOs involved in the programme are not limited to parliamentary political parties, but also include non-parliamentary parties, as well as organisations predominantly led by young people and which have strengthened their organisational capacities.

Even non-parliamentary CSOs and parties have been included in our training programme to strengthen the skills of their members and, consequently, of their organisations. This highlights the programme's impact on both the participants and the organisations themselves. Furthermore, the PoD's activities are as appealing to CSOs as they are to young participants.

The final value exceeds the final objective, as the programme – following adjustments in response to changes in the context – has seen new programmes designed and adapted within the framework of the PoD to better meet the needs of young people, thereby having a greater impact on their pathways and involving more CSOs.

2.2.3 Intermediate Outcome Indicator 3

This indicator measures the number of CSOs included in the PoD programme, represented in the training programmes by their young members, the first level – the mixed-gender TSoP1 class – as well as in the ToT class, which has a clear organisational structure and was implemented up to 2023, the OOC class, a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025; the second level, TSoP2, implemented in 2025; the Women & Youth Academy MPs Academy, implemented in 2025; and the ToT1 & ToT2 (both programmes implemented in 2025).

This indicator is measured using the database updated on the basis of the application forms completed by participants in the first-level mixed-gender TSoP1 course, the ToT course (up to 2023), the OOC course (2024 and



2025), the second-level TSoP2 course (2025), the Women & Youth Academy and MPs Academy (2025), and ToT1 and ToT2 (both in 2025).

The definition of the indicator and the data collection process remained the same between the baseline and the final measurement, whilst the programmes taken into account for the calculation have changed.

The figure 39 represents the total number of CSOs included in the PoD programme from 2021 to 2023, including new CSOs that have emerged as well as those that no longer exist due to policy changes.

The figure 101 represents the total number of CSOs that were represented in the various PoD training programmes between 2021 and 2025, taking into account all the improvements made to the programmes following each evaluation to better meet participants' needs and adapt to changes in the country's context.

The baseline was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the final figure represents the number of CSOs—having strengthened their organisational capacities—represented in the first mixed-class level TSoP1, as well as in the ToT class, which has a clear organisational structure and was implemented up to 2023, the OOC cohort – a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025 – the second-level TSoP2 cohort implemented in 2025, the Women & Youth Academy and MPs Academy implemented in 2025, and the ToT1 and ToT2 programmes (both implemented in 2025).

Due to the national context, the PoD programme involves not only parliamentary political parties but also other recently emerged CSOs. Non-parliamentary CSOs and parties have been included in our training programme in order to strengthen the skills of their members and, consequently, their organisations.

The actual value exceeded the final target, as the PoD programme – following adjustments in response to changes in the context – saw new programmes designed and adapted within the PoD framework to better meet the needs of young people, thereby having a greater impact on their pathways and involving more CSOs.

2.2.4 Intermediate outcome indicator 4

This indicator is used to measure the number of participants – women and young leaders – trained in the first level (mixed-gender class) TSoP1, as well as in the ToT class (running until 2023), the OOC class (a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025), the second-level TSoP2 programme (to be implemented in 2025), the Women & Youth Academy MPs Academy (to be implemented in 2025) and the ToT1 & ToT2 programmes (both to be implemented in 2025).

This indicator was measured based on the positions held by participants within their organisations, with information gathered from the database updated using application forms and questionnaires.

The definition of the indicator and the data collection process remained the same between the baseline measurement and the final measurement.

The figure 539 represents the number of participants – women and young leaders – out of a total of 560 participants from the first mixed-gender TSoP1 level, ToT (implemented up to 2023), the OOC cohort (in 2024 and 2025), the second level TSoP2 (implemented in 2025), the Women & Youth MPs Academy (implemented in 2025) and ToT1 & ToT2 (both programmes implemented in 2025).



The baseline was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the final figure represents the cumulative number of participants – women and young leaders – who took part in training activities between 2021 and 2025, taking into account the progression of the various programmes.

This highlights the programme's positive impact on participants, helping them to attain leadership positions within their organisations, alongside our local partners who recognise the need to build the capacity of their women and young leaders.

The actual figure exceeds the final target, given that, following adjustments related to changes in the context, new programmes have been designed and adapted within the framework of the PoD to better meet the needs of young people, thereby having a greater impact on their career paths.

2.2.5 Intermediate outcome indicator 5

This indicator is used to measure the number of representatives (men and women) of political actors who have participated in training activities focused on democratic values, namely the first level – mixed-gender TSoP1 class, as well as the ToT class (implemented until 2023), the OOC course (a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025), the second level TSoP2 (to be implemented in 2025), the Women & Youth Academy MPs Academy (to be implemented in 2025) and the ToT1 & ToT2 (both programmes to be implemented in 2025).

This indicator was measured using data collected from the database. The definition of the indicator and the data collection process remained the same between the baseline measurement and the final measurement.

The figure 589 represents the total number of representatives (men and women) of political actors who participated in the first mixed-gender TSoP1 course, as well as in the ToT course (implemented up to 2023), the OOC course (a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025), the second-level TSoP2 (to be implemented in 2025), the Women & Youth Academy MPs Academy (to be implemented in 2025) and the ToT1 & ToT2 (both programmes to be implemented in 2025).

These representatives were selected each year in accordance with the CEMI selection process to represent their respective political parties and CSOs in the PoD programme: the first level – the mixed-gender TSoP1 cohort – as well as the ToT cohort (implemented until 2023), the OOC cohort (a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025), the second level TSoP2 (implemented in 2025), the Women & Youth Academy and MPs Academy (to be implemented in 2025) and the ToT1 & ToT2 (both programmes to be implemented in 2025).

Although the national context and the social, economic and political climate are particularly challenging for young people, we have managed to maintain the number of selected participants as planned.

The baseline was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the final figure represents the cumulative number of participants (political actors), both women and men, who took part in training activities between 2021 and 2025: the first mixed-gender TSoP1 cohort, as well as the ToT cohort (implemented up to 2023), the OOC cohort (a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025), the second TSoP2 cohort (implemented in 2025), the Women & Youth Academy MPs Academy (implemented in 2025) and the ToT1 & ToT2 (both programmes implemented in 2025).

Despite political, economic and social challenges, young people remain keen to take part in CEMI's training cycles, which focus on democratic values, dialogue, tolerance and pluralism, particularly as the first-level TSoP1 class is



a mixed group bringing together participants from political parties and organisations with diverse backgrounds, ideologies and affiliations.

Due to changes in the national context, the PoD programmes have been adjusted and others have been designed part-way through to better meet the needs of young people, which explains the difference between the final figure and the final target set during the initial phase of the PoD.

2.2.6 Intermediate outcome indicator 6

This indicator is used to measure the number of leaders – women and young people – who are involved in CEMI programmes and who will be able to pass on their knowledge and skills, namely the first level – the mixed-gender TSoP1 class – as well as the ToT class (running until 2023), the OOC course (a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025), the second level TSoP2 (to be implemented in 2025), the Women & Youth Academy MPs Academy (to be implemented in 2025) and the ToT 1 & ToT 2 (both programmes to be implemented in 2025). This indicator is also used to measure the number of videos produced on the ‘Freesh’ YouTube channel. As we had to choose from a limited number of indicators, we are using this indicator to measure both the number of leaders – women and young people – involved in CEMI’s training programmes and the number of videos produced on the ‘Freesh’ YouTube channel, even though the indicator does not explicitly mention the number of videos or the Freesh channel. The ‘Freesh’ YouTube channel was designed to be a digital platform for amplifying young people’s voices, which aligns with this intermediate outcome.

This indicator was measured based on the positions held by participants within their organisations, information gathered from the database updated using application forms and questionnaires, as well as by taking into account the number of videos produced on the ‘Freesh’ YouTube channel, which is a platform also present on Facebook and Instagram and produces digital political content aimed at disengaged young people, regarded as a tool for disseminating simplified political knowledge.

The definition of the indicator and the data collection process remained the same between the baseline measurement and the final measurement.

The figure 557 represents the number of young leaders from the first level – the mixed-gender TSoP1 class – as well as from the ToT class (implemented until 2023), the OOC class (a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025), the second level TSoP2 (implemented in 2025), the Women & Youth Academy MPs Academy (to be implemented in 2025) and the ToT 1 & ToT 2 programmes (both to be implemented in 2025).

The figure 673 corresponds to the total number of Freesh videos produced and published between 2021 and 2025.

The baseline was set at 0 during the programme’s launch phase, whilst the final figure represents, on the one hand, the number of young leaders involved in the first level – the mixed-gender TSoP1 class – as well as in the ToT class (implemented up to 2023), the OOC class (a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025), the second level TSoP2 (implemented in 2025), the Women & Youth Academy MPs Academy (to be implemented in 2025) and the ToT1 & ToT2 programmes (both to be implemented in 2025) – accumulated between 2021 and 2025; and, secondly, the number of videos produced and published on the Freesh YouTube channel, also accumulated between 2021 and 2025.



This highlights the programme's impact on participants, helping them to attain leadership positions within their organisations, as well as the commitment of our local partners, who recognise the need to strengthen the skills of their women and young leaders, enabling them to share the knowledge and skills acquired within their respective organisations and with other young people. Furthermore, the content posted on the Fresh YouTube channel has proved highly popular with young people who are not currently engaged, resulting in a steady increase in the number of videos published each year.

Due to changes in the national context, the PoD programmes have been adjusted and others have been designed partway through the programme to better meet young people's needs; this explains the difference between the final outcome and the final objective that was defined during the initial phase of the PoD.

LTO2 : Young people and women aspiring to become political and civic leaders are influential agents of change (regional level).

2.3.1 Impact indicator 2

This indicator is used to measure the number of women and young people who took part in the PoD programme's regional activities and who indicated, in the questionnaire distributed at the start of each activity, that they feel capable of participating in decision-making processes. Until 2023, the regional activities covered by this indicator were the regional academies, held once a year and aimed exclusively at young people and women from the MENA region (Jordan, Libya, Algeria, Morocco and Iraq). In 2024 and 2025, these activities evolved and were implemented twice a year: one session targeting young people from the MENA region and a second session dedicated to young people from French-speaking Africa (Benin, Burkina Faso, Mali, Senegal and Niger).

This indicator was measured using data collected via the questionnaire distributed at the start of the activities. The definition of the indicator and the data collection process remained the same between the baseline measurement and the final measurement.

The figure 127 represents the number of women and young people from the MENA region who took part in the PoD programme's regional activities between 2021 and 2023 and who indicated in the questionnaire that they feel capable of participating in decision-making processes. The figure 233 represents the number of women and young people from the MENA region who took part in the PoD programme's regional activities between 2021 and 2025, taking into account changes in regional activities.

Indeed, being able to participate in the decision-making processes of a political party or a CSO means that they are not merely young or voiceless members; they are involved in the governing bodies when it comes to making a decision, issuing a statement or adopting a position that is important for the party or CSO. Of course, not all members are involved or listened to, particularly young people or women. The questionnaire used to measure this indicator quantitatively contains a clear question asking whether they feel able to participate in the decision-making processes of their respective political parties or CSOs.

The baseline was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the final value represents the number of women and young people who participated in regional activities as political actors between 2021 and 2025. Furthermore, the number of affirmative responses to the question regarding their ability to participate in decision-making has increased, which can be explained by the CSOs' choice when selecting their representatives to take part in the regional programme.



This highlights the programme's impact on participants, helping them to attain leadership positions within their organisations, as well as the commitment of our regional partners, who recognise the need to strengthen the skills of their female and young leaders, who are able to share the knowledge and skills acquired within their respective organisations and with other young people.

Until 2023, the regional activities covered by this indicator were the regional academies, organised at a rate of one session per year, targeting exclusively young people and women from the MENA region (Jordan, Libya, Algeria, Morocco and Iraq). In 2024 and 2025, these activities evolved and were implemented twice a year: one session targeting young people from the MENA region and a second session dedicated to young people from French-speaking Africa (Benin, Burkina Faso, Mali, Senegal and Niger); this explains the difference between the final value and the final target.

2.3.2 Intermediate outcome indicator 7

This indicator is used to measure the number of CSOs with a clear organisational structure that have strengthened their organisational capacity, as represented in the regional activities of the PoD programme: the Regional Academy, which, until 2023, was implemented at a rate of one session per year, targeting exclusively young people and women from the MENA region (Jordan, Libya, Algeria, Morocco and Iraq). In 2024 and 2025, these activities evolved and were implemented twice a year: one session targeting young people from the MENA region and a second session dedicated to young people from French-speaking Africa (Benin, Burkina Faso, Mali, Senegal and Niger). This indicator is also used to measure the number of CSOs represented at the regional conference.

This indicator was measured using data collected via the questionnaire distributed at the start of the activities. The definition of the indicator and the data collection process remained the same between the baseline measurement and the final measurement.

The figure 42 represents the number of CSOs from the MENA region that have strengthened their organisational capacities and were represented by their members in the PoD programme's regional activities between 2021 and 2023, whilst the figure 158 represents the number of CSOs from the MENA region and the countries of French-speaking Africa that have strengthened their organisational capacities and were represented by their members in the PoD programme's regional activities between 2021 and 2025, taking into account changes in regional activities.

The baseline was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the final value represents the cumulative number of CSOs that have strengthened their organisational capacities and been represented in the PoD programme's regional activities between 2021 and 2025, which has increased year on year as more CSOs have been included in the regional programme and the number of activities has risen in 2024 and 2025.

Up until 2023, the regional activities covered by this indicator were the regional academies, organised at a rate of one session per year, targeting exclusively young people and women from the MENA region (Jordan, Libya,



Algeria, Morocco and Iraq). In 2024 and 2025, these activities evolved and were implemented twice a year: one session targeting young people from the MENA region and a second session dedicated to young people from French-speaking Africa (Benin, Burkina Faso, Mali, Senegal and Niger); this explains the difference between the final value and the final target. This also shows that, each year, an increasing number of CSOs are taking an interest in CEMI's regional programmes.

2.3.4 Intermediate impact indicator 8

This indicator is used to measure the number of youth-led CSOs – including political parties and CSOs – from the MENA region and French-speaking African countries included in the PoD programme and represented in the programme's regional activities.

This indicator was measured using data collected via the questionnaire distributed at the start of the activities. The definition of the indicator and the data collection process remained the same between the baseline measurement and the final measurement. The questionnaire includes a question regarding the participants' identity, in particular the political party or CSO to which they belong. This indicator is used to measure all CSOs included in the regional PoD programme, and not just those led by young people.

The figure 61 represents the number of CSOs from the MENA region represented by their members in the regional PoD programme between 2021 and 2023. The figure 177 represents the number of CSOs from the MENA region and French-speaking African countries represented by their young people in regional activities between 2021 and 2025.

The baseline was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the final figure represents the number of CSOs from the MENA region and French-speaking African countries represented in regional activities, accumulated between 2021 and 2025.

This shows that, each year, an increasing number of CSOs from the MENA region are taking an interest in CEMI's regional programmes and that CEMI's regional network is expanding. It also implies that these CSOs act as a genuine springboard for their young participants to become political actors.

2.3.5 Intermediate impact indicator 9

This indicator measures the number of women and young leaders who took part in regional training activities between 2021 and 2025: the regional academies, organised at a rate of one session per year, targeting exclusively young people and women from the MENA region (Jordan, Libya, Algeria, Morocco and Iraq) up to 202; and in



2024 and 2025, these activities evolved and were implemented twice a year: one session targeting young people from the MENA region and a second session dedicated to young people from French-speaking Africa (Benin, Burkina Faso, Mali, Senegal and Niger),

It was evaluated on the basis of data collected via the questionnaire administered at the start of the activities. The definition of the indicator and the data collection process remained unchanged between the baseline measurement and the final measurement.

The figure 83 represents the total number of women and young leaders who took part in the regional training sessions up to 2023, whilst the figure 180 represents the total number of women and young leaders who took part in the regional training sessions between 2021 and 2025. These figures reflect the calibre of the candidates selected by their respective CSOs to participate in the CEMI regional programme.

The baseline was set at 0 during the programme's start-up phase, whilst the final value corresponds to the cumulative number of women and young leaders trained as part of regional activities between 2021 and 2025.

Even at regional level, young people continue to seek safe spaces that promote democracy, tolerance, pluralism and dialogue, where they can develop new knowledge, discuss their political experiences and share the obstacles they face.

Until 2023, the CEMI organised the Regional Academy at a rate of one session per year, targeting exclusively young people and women from the MENA region (Jordan, Libya, Algeria, Morocco and Iraq). In 2024 and 2025, these activities evolved and were implemented twice a year: one session targeting young people from the MENA region and a second session dedicated to young people from French-speaking Africa (Benin, Burkina Faso, Mali, Senegal and Niger), which explains the difference between the final value and the final target.

This indicator measures the number of women and young leaders who took part in regional training activities between 2021 and 2025: the regional academies, organised at a rate of one session per year, targeting exclusively young people and women from the MENA region (Jordan, Libya, Algeria, Morocco and Iraq) up to 202; in 2024 and 2025, these activities evolved and were implemented twice a year: one session targeting young people from the MENA region and a second session dedicated to young people from French-speaking Africa (Benin, Burkina Faso, Mali, Senegal and Niger).

It was assessed on the basis of data collected via the questionnaire administered at the start of the activities. The definition of the indicator and the data collection process remained unchanged between the baseline and the mid-term evaluation.

The figure of 83 represents the total number of women and young leaders who took part in the regional training sessions up to mid-2023, whilst the figure of 208 represents the total number of women and young leaders who took part in the regional training sessions between 2021 and 2025. These figures reflect the calibre of the candidates selected by their respective CSOs to participate in the CEMI regional programme.

The baseline was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the final figure corresponds to the cumulative number of women and young leaders trained as part of regional activities between 2021 and 2025. Indeed, in addition to the increase in the number of regional academies in 2024 and 2025 and the corresponding



rise in the number of participants, each year more and more women and young leaders are nominated by their organisations to take part in the training programmes, as these organisations have recognised the impact of the programme on members of previous cohorts.

Each year, too, more young people holding positions of responsibility within their organisations are selected to take part in regional activities, and they have demonstrated strong commitment and genuine engagement during these activities.

This indicator measures the number of participants, men and women, representing political actors who took part in regional training activities between 2021 and 2025: the regional academies, organised at a rate of one session per year, targeting exclusively young people and women from the MENA region (Jordan, Libya, Algeria, Morocco and Iraq) up to 2023; and in 2024 and 2025, these activities evolved and were implemented twice a year: one session targeting young people from the MENA region and a second session dedicated to young people from French-speaking Africa (Benin, Burkina Faso, Mali, Senegal and Niger),

It was assessed on the basis of data collected via the questionnaire administered at the start of the regional activities. The definition of the indicator and the data collection process remained unchanged between the baseline and the final assessment.

The figure 102 represents the number of young people (men and women) representing political actors from the MENA region who took part in the CEMI regional academies between 2021 and 2023. The figure 208 represents the number of young people (men and women) who took part in the regional academies between 2021 and 2025: the regional academies, organised at a rate of one session per year, targeted exclusively young people and women from the MENA region (Jordan, Libya, Algeria, Morocco and Iraq) until 2023; in 2024 and 2025, these activities evolved and were held twice a year: one session targeting young people from the MENA region and a second session dedicated to young people from French-speaking Africa (Benin, Burkina Faso, Mali, Senegal and Niger).

The baseline was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the final figure corresponds to the cumulative number of participants representing stakeholders who took part in the CEMI regional academies between 2021 and 2025.

The difference between the final value and the final target is due to the change in the number of regional academies implemented between 2021 and 2025 and the consequent increase in the number of participants.

This indicator relates to the number of cross-party dialogue meetings, including TSoP debates, MDP meetings up to 2023, public debates, political couscous, Youth Collaborative Platforms and advisory council meetings.

It was measured on the basis of the number of inter-party dialogue meetings organised by the CEMI as part of the PoD programme.

The definition and data collection process remained the same between the baseline and the final value.

The figure 28 represents the total number of inter-party dialogue meetings organised, and the figure 41 represents the total number of dialogue activities organised between 2021 and 2025.

The baseline was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the interim value corresponds to the number of inter-party dialogue meetings held between 2021 and mid-2023. The MDP meeting was the only activity that was suspended in 2022 due to changes in the political context. The final value corresponds to the total number of dialogue activities carried out between 2021 and 2025, taking into account the MDP meeting, which was not resumed.

Inter-party dialogue meetings provide a safe space, valued by political actors of different affiliations, as they facilitate debate and the exchange of diverse political opinions and perspectives — which also aligns with one of the CEMI's objectives. Furthermore, these meetings remain attractive and relevant to representatives of political parties and CSOs, regardless of the context, despite the suspension of the MDP meetings.

This indicator relates to the number of representatives (men/women) from political actors who participated — actively or otherwise — in inter-party dialogue meetings, including TSoP debates, MDP meetings up to mid-2023, public debates, political couscous, Youth Collaborative Platforms and the advisory board.

It was measured on the basis of attendance lists for the inter-party dialogue meetings held. The definition and data collection process remained the same between the baseline and the final value.

The figure 850 represents the total number of representatives (men and women) from political actors who participated in inter-party dialogue meetings, including TSoP debates, MDP meetings, public debates and advisory councils. The figure 1,162 represents the number of participants up to 2023, as well as those who took part in the dialogue activities carried out in 2024 and 2025.

The baseline was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the final value corresponds to the number of representatives (men/women) from political actors who took part in dialogue activities between 2021 and 2025.

The number of participants increases with the number of cross-party dialogue meetings organised and depends on the significance and appeal of the topic discussed. It also depends on the type of meeting, as this indicator encompasses various formats: TSoP debates, MDP meetings, 'couscous politique' public debates, the Youth Collaborative Platforms and the advisory council.

As cross-party dialogue meetings consistently focus on topical issues of interest to political actors, participation rates remain high, and participants have expressed a desire for more such meetings.

This indicator relates to the number of agreements reached following inter-party dialogue meetings, such as MDP meetings and the Youth Collaborative platform. It was measured on the basis of the number of agreements reached, as reported in previous activity reports.

The definition and data collection process remained the same between the baseline and the final measurement.

The figure of 3 represents the number of agreements reached between 2021 and mid-2023: two agreements were reached during MDP meetings and one agreement within the Youth Collaborative Platform. This indicator measures the number of agreements actually reached, meaning that all the members concerned agreed on certain points relating to a given topic and signed the agreement. Each agreement has its own specific features. As part of the MDP meetings, MDP members — senior officials from political parties — concluded two agreements, signed by the leaders of their respective parties:



- The first was a Charter for a Healthy Electoral Climate relating to the local elections;
- The second concerned fair electoral competition in the context of parliamentary elections.

As for the third agreement, it was concluded within the youth collaborative platform in response to the coup of 25 July 2021. This platform is made up of TSoP alumni from different political and ideological backgrounds, who agreed on a list of moral, democratic and inclusive values and principles aimed at guiding their collaboration to defend democracy in Tunisia.

The baseline value was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the interim value represents the number of agreements concluded between 2021 and mid-2023.

This outcome depends not only on the effectiveness of the cross-party dialogue meetings, but also on the political context, which can act as a major obstacle. Owing to the political context, the MDP platform was suspended, as it was no longer possible to bring its members—senior officials from political parties—together. The coup of 25 July 2021 had a major impact on activities, causing tensions within the MDP platform itself between members who supported the president and the coup and those who opposed it.

It is virtually impossible to predict the number of future agreements, as the political context is constantly changing, which has made it difficult to keep the MDP functioning.

The number of agreements has remained unchanged, due to the delicate national context.

This indicator was measured on the basis of attendance lists relating to the dialogue activities carried out by the CEMI.

The definition and data collection process remained the same between the baseline and the final value.

The figure of 1,202 represents the cumulative total number of civic and political actors who participated — actively or otherwise — in the dialogue activities carried out between 2021 and 2023: the Couscous Politique, the TSoP debates and the Youth Collaborative Platform. This figure includes all participants, whether or not they played an active role, as, in the current context, simply attending a debate constitutes a form of participation. The figure 1,661 encompasses the cumulative total number of civic and political actors who took part in the dialogue activities carried out between 2021 and 2023, in addition to the total number of participants who took part in the dialogue activities carried out in 2024 and 2025.

The baseline figure was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the final figure represents the cumulative number of civic and political actors who took part in dialogue activities between 2021 and 2025.



The difference between the baseline value and the final value reflects the interest shown by political and civic actors in dialogue activities, particularly as democratic spaces are shrinking due to the national context. The activities provided an opportunity to address issues linked to contextual developments, particularly political ones, through discussions initiated between the civic and political stakeholders present, despite the diversity of their profiles, affiliations and perspectives. This diversity enriches the exchanges, facilitating a more comprehensive exploration of the topics covered.

This indicator was measured based on the number of inter-party dialogue meetings held, as recorded in the CEMI's activity reports. The definition and data collection process remained the same between the baseline and the final value.

The figure of 37 represents the number of cross-party dialogue meetings organised between 2021 and 2023, including TSoP debates, Couscous Politique, MDP meetings and advisory board meetings. The figure 54 encompasses the number of dialogue activities carried out between 2021 and 2023, in addition to those carried out in 2024 and 2025.

The baseline figure was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the final figure corresponds to the number of cross-party dialogue activities carried out between 2021 and 2025. During this period, only the MDP meetings were suspended in 2022 for reasons linked to the political context.

Inter-party dialogue meetings provide safe and inclusive spaces, valued by political actors of different affiliations, as they foster debate and the exchange of diverse political opinions and perspectives — which also aligns with one of the CEMI's objectives. Furthermore, these meetings remain attractive and important to representatives of political parties, regardless of the circumstances.

This indicator relates to the number of workshops bringing together various political and civic stakeholders, including those held as part of the PoD training programmes: the first mixed-level TSoP1 course, as well as the ToT course (implemented until 2023), the OOC course (a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025), the second-level TSoP2 course (implemented in 2025), the Women & Youth Academy MPs Academy (to be implemented in 2025) and the ToT1 & ToT2 programmes (both to be implemented in 2025). The workshops are organised following the theoretical part of the training to facilitate better assimilation of the content and to provide a space where participants can discuss their ideas relating to the topic covered during the session.

This indicator was measured based on the number of workshops held during the PoD training cycles: the first level – the mixed-gender TSoP1 class – as well as the ToT class (implemented up to 2023), the OOC class (a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025), the second level TSoP2 (to be implemented in 2025), the Women & Youth Academy MPs Academy (to be implemented in 2025) and the ToT1 & ToT2 (both programmes to be implemented in 2025). The definition and data collection process remained the same between the baseline and the final measurement.

The figure of 2,370 represents the total number of workshops delivered in the PoD training cycles: the first level – the mixed-gender TSoP1 class – as well as the ToT class (implemented up to 2023), the OOC class (a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025), the second level TSoP2 (implemented in 2025), the Women & Youth Academy MPs Academy (to be implemented in 2025) and the ToT1 & ToT2 programmes (both to be implemented in 2025).

The figure 122 represents the number of publications produced by the CEMI's research unit between 2021 and 2025.

The baseline value was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the final value corresponds to the number of workshops bringing together various political and civic stakeholders, including those held as part of the first level – the mixed-group TSoP1 class – as well as in the ToT class (implemented up to 2023), the OOC cohort (a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025), the second level TSoP2 (implemented in 2025), the Women & Youth Academy MPs Academy (implemented in 2025) and the ToT1 & ToT2 (both programmes implemented in 2025).

These workshops foster constructive dialogue, as political and civic actors collaborate, share their perspectives and work collectively towards common goals. They are particularly valued at this crucial time, marked by a narrowing of democratic spaces. The CEMI is always committed to providing this inclusive and collaborative space on an ongoing basis.

The final outcome exceeds the original objective, as the CEMI has adapted its training programmes by increasing the number of workshops to meet participants' demand for more workshops and discussions. Furthermore, due to changes in the national context, the PoD programmes have been adjusted and others have been designed part-way through the programme to better meet the needs of young people; this explains the difference between the final value and the final objective, which was defined during the initial phase of the PoD.

This indicator relates to the number of spaces created or opened for women and young people at national level.

It has been measured on the basis of the number of spaces created or opened by the CEMI, as reported in its activity reports, as well as their sustainability. It refers to all types of spaces that the CEMI makes available to young people and women – whether they are alumni, politically active or not – where they can exchange and discuss their views, ideas, etc. These spaces may be digital, such as the Freesh platform aimed at all young people, or physical, such as the first mixed-gender TSoP1 class for young people involved in political parties and CSOs, the Youth Council for non-engaged young people, and the collaborative youth platform for all young people. The sustainability of some of these spaces depends on the national political context, particularly in the event of a narrowing of democratic spaces.

The definition and data collection process remained the same between the baseline and the final assessment.

The figure of 27 represents the number of spaces opened for women and young people at national level, including the first mixed-level TSoP1 class, the OOC class (a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025), the second-level TSoP2 (implemented in 2025), the Women & Youth Academy MPs Academy (implemented in 2025) and the ToT1 & ToT2 (both programmes implemented in 2025), the Youth Council, the Youth Collaborative Platforms and the Freesh digital platform.

The baseline value was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the final value corresponds to the total number of spaces created or opened for women and young people at national level between 2021 and 2025.

To adapt to the national context, new spaces have been created for women and young people, covering the four identified categories: young people affiliated with political parties; young people affiliated with CSOs; young people not involved in any form of traditional organisation but interested in public affairs; and young people who are neither involved nor interested in public affairs. The CEMI continues to adapt its programmes and activities to better meet the needs and profiles of its target audiences.

The final value exceeds the final target because, due to changes in the national context, the PoD programmes were adjusted and others were designed at the mid-point to better meet the needs of young people, which explains the difference between the final value and the final target that was defined during the initial phase of the PoD.

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This indicator relates to the number of participants (men/women), whether they are politically active young people representing political parties and CSOs or non-politically active young people, who have taken part in training activities focused on democratic values, including the first level – the mixed-gender TSoP1 class – as well as the ToT class (to be implemented until 2023), the OOC course (a programme designed to replace the ToT in 2024 and 2025), the second level TSoP2 (to be implemented in 2025), the Women & Youth Academy MPs Academy (to be implemented in 2025) and the ToT1 & ToT2 (both programmes to be implemented in 2025), the Youth Council, the Youth Collaborative Platforms, the Freesh digital platform, the TSoP debates, the political roundtables and the advisory board.

Given that we had to choose, from a limited number of indicators, the one whose meaning most closely aligned with our programmes, we adapted this indicator to measure two distinct entities:

- On the one hand, the number of participants (men/women) – whether engaged young people representing political parties and CSOs or unengaged young people – who took part in training activities focused on democratic values (TSoP1, ToT up to 2023, OOC, Women & Youth MPs Academy, ToT1, ToT2, Youth Council, Youth Collaborative Platform, Freesh, TSoP Debate, Political Couscous and Advisory Council);
- Furthermore, the number of subscribers registered on the Freesh YouTube channel, even though the indicator does not explicitly mention this figure. Indeed, the Freesh YouTube channel provides an inclusive digital space for young people, engaging various groups: young people involved in political parties, young people involved in CSOs, young people who are not politically active but are interested in public affairs, and young people who are neither politically active nor interested in public affairs.

This indicator was measured using attendance lists for the following activities: TSoP1, ToT up to 2023, OOC, Women & Youth MPs Academy, ToT1, ToT2, Youth Council, Youth Collaborative Platform, TSoP Debate, Political Couscous and the Advisory Council, as well as the number of subscribers to the Freesh YouTube channel.

The definition and data collection process remained the same between the baseline and the final measurement.

1,384 represents the number of participants (men/women) – whether engaged young people representing political parties and CSOs or unengaged young people – who took part in training activities focused on democratic values (TSoP1, ToT up to 2023, OOC, Women & Youth Academy, ToT1, ToT2, Youth Council, Youth Collaborative Platform, Freesh, TSoP Debate, Political Couscous and Advisory Board)

64.5 K represents the number of subscribers to the Freesh YouTube channel, including non-engaged young people who interact with and react to the published content, which offers simplified political content.

The baseline figure was set at 0 during the programme's launch phase, whilst the final figure corresponds to the total number of participants (men/women) – whether politically engaged young people representing political parties and CSOs or politically disengaged young people – who took part in training activities focused on democratic values (TSoP1, ToT up to 2023, OOC, TSoP2, Women & Youth MPs Academy, ToT1, ToT2, Youth Council, Youth Collaborative Platform, Freesh, TSoP Debate, Political Couscous and Advisory Council), between 2021 and 2025.

CEMI has adapted its programmes and activities to better meet the needs and profiles of its target audiences, by involving more young people and women and by launching the Freesh YouTube channel and the Youth Collaborative Platform.

The final figure exceeds the final target because, due to changes in the national context, the PoD programmes were adjusted and others were designed midway through the project to better meet young people's needs; this explains the difference between the final figure and the final target set during the initial phase of the PoD. As for the number of subscribers to the Freesh YouTube channel, the final figure also exceeds the final target, demonstrating young people's growing interest in simplified democratic content and the effectiveness of this inclusive digital space.
